Order of Service

I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. John 15:15

Invocation and Call to Worship

- P We gather for worship today to be encouraged by the powerful presence of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- P May the God of endurance and encouragement grant us
- C To live in harmony with one another and in accord with Christ Jesus. (Romans 15:5)
- P So if there is any encouragement in Christ,
- C Any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit,
- P Any affection and sympathy,
- C Complete my joy by being of one mind,
- P Having the same love,
- C Being in full accord and of one mind. (Philippians 2:1-2)
- P Therefore encourage one another
- C And build one another up, just as you are doing. (1 Thessalonians 5:11)

- Take courage, friends! Jesus forgives you of all of your sins. Let your hearts be strengthened, your souls be refreshed, your minds be renewed and your spirits be encouraged. Jesus has nailed your sins to the cross and thrown them into the tomb. Your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Having been forgiven by Jesus, let us now live for him.
- C What a friend we have in Jesus.

Prayer of the Day

- P Lord God, You have called Your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go but only that Your hand is leading us and Your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.

Old Testament Reading Isaiah 41:8–11

P A reading from Isaiah, the forty-first chapter.

⁸But you, Israel, my servant, Jacob, whom I have chosen, the offspring of Abraham, my friend; ⁹you whom I took from the ends of the earth, and called from its farthest corners, saying to you, "You are my servant, I have chosen you and not cast you off"; ¹⁰fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. ¹¹Behold, all who are incensed against you shall be put to shame and confounded; those who strive against you shall be as nothing and shall perish.

Epistle Reading 1 Thessalonians 5:5–11

P The Epistle is from 1 Thessalonians, chapter 5.

⁵For you are all children of light, children of the day. We are not of the night or of the darkness. ⁶So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober. ⁷For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, are drunk at night. ⁸But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. ⁹For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁰who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. ¹¹Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.

Gospel Reading Matthew 8:5–13

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the eighth chapter.
- C Glory to You, O Lord.

⁵When he entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him, appealing to him, ⁶"Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, suffering terribly." ⁷And he said to him, "I will come and heal him." ⁸But the centurion replied, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof, but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. ⁹For I too am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." ¹⁰When Jesus heard this, he marveled and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I tell you, with no one in Israel have I found such faith. ¹¹I tell you, many will come from east and west and recline at table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, ¹²while the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."
